Urban carriage horses are purely a tourist attraction—not a necessity. Given the many documented health and welfare issues for the horses, including being overworked and worked when it's too hot and too cold, the only sensible solution is to ban them from use. We welcome a six month phase out knowing that those who work in the carriage horse trade would need to find new employment.

The Partnership to Ban Horse Carriages Worldwide urges a ban on horse-drawn carriages used as tourist attractions.

The constant exposure to traffic, noise, and pollution; the long hours of standing and walking on hard surfaces; the hard labor under sometimes extreme weather conditions; the high probability of accidents to both humans and horses; and lack of pasture access are not consistent with the owners' responsibility to provide high-quality, long-term care for the horses.
